I wish to extend greetings to the members of 783 Wing from the National Executive Council and Alberta Group. Both levels of the organization have been busy and it is wonderful to report that all five wings in Alberta Group are in good shape and under good leadership. Indeed, as of our last group meeting this past weekend the total membership in Alberta Group is closing in on 500 members. This completely defies the national trend over the last decade. - Our group AGM will be held in Lethbridge on the weekend of Apr 22-24, 2016, with BGen David Lothian, Deputy Commander, Force Generation, 1 Canadian Air Division, as Guest of Honour.



STOVE TOP Classic One-Dish Chicken Bake with Vegetables



What You Need

- 1 cup hot water
- 1 pkg. (120 g) Stove Top Lower Sodium Stuffing Mix for Chicken
- 1 lb. (450 g) boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into bite-size pieces
- 1 can (10 fl oz/284 mL) condensed cream of chicken soup
- 1/3 cup sour cream
- 3 Add hot water to stuffing mix; stir just until moistened.

Combine remaining ingredients in 13x9-inch baking dish; top with stuffing.

Bake 30 min. or until casserole is heated through and chicken is done.

Or add

2 cups frozen mixed vegetables (carrots, corn, green beans add, peas, thawed, drained) prepare as directed, stirring 1-1/2 cups *Kraft* Part Skim Mozzarella Shredded Cheese into chicken mixture before topping.

Heat oven to 400°Fg with stuffing.



What you need:

1 package of Blamonge pudding mix or carton of Vanilla Yogurt

6 half apricots (canned)

Splash of Peach Schnapps

Do this

Prepare pudding mix as per the package.

On individual dishes place large spoonful of Blamonge or Yogurt mix

Beloved Dad to Mavis Hutchings (Glenn Mettlewsky) of Calgary and Carol (Richard) Gwatkin of Lethbridge, Grandad of Willy Gwatkin of Lethbridge, nieces Laura Jones of Vancouver, Lois Petch of Kamloops and nephew Gordon Jones of Midway, B.C. He was predeceased by his wife Stella, parents William and Elizabeth Hutchings and his sister Eva. Art was born and raised in Weymouth, England. Upon leaving school he apprenticed with great Western Railway at Weymouth. He joined RAF in 1939 and came to Canada with the Commonwealth air training plan as a fitter then as aircrew, receiving wings and returning to England and the RAF in 1943. He and Stella were married in 1945 and daughter Carol was born in 1946. 


